Overview of Proceedings Manuscript Instructions

Thank you for your interest in preparing a manuscript for the proceedings volume of The 10th Pacific Rim International Conference on Advanced Materials and Processing (PRICM10). The following overview may assist authors with some of the most common questions about submitting a manuscript.

About the Publication

All the accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings which will not be released to the public and will be available at the conference beginning on 18 August 2019.

Deadlines

• The deadline for final, publication-ready manuscripts is 1 May 2019.

Page Limits

• Plenary paper: 10 pages at the maximum

Keynote and Invited paper: 8 pages at the maximum

Contributed paper: 4-6 pages

Formatting: All Publications

The volume of PRICM10 will be published in one-column format, so please use the one-column template and instructions the follow. For all proceedings manuscripts, please use these tips to avoid common formatting errors:

1. Manuscript

The composition of manuscripts should be the following: title, authors' names, affiliations, abstract, key words, introduction, body of paper, conclusions, references. See details in attached format sample.

2. Typing

The manuscripts should be typewritten or printed by laser printer on only one side of each standard A4 sheet and paginated throughout (including the abstract, figure captions, tables, and reference section). The printing should be in one column in good book face of 10.5 p in total of 46 lines. The margins for the page are 30 mm from upper and 20 from bottom edges, left edges and right edges.

3 Figures

The words, letters and symbols in figures should be in 7.5 p, the vector and matrix in bold; and axis captions in coordinate graphics should be complete and should include measure words, units and symbols.

4. Tables

There should be only one table per sheet, with numbers and titles placed above the tables, with three lines and auxiliary lines if necessary.

5. Symbols

The symbols showing physic quantities, letters identifying points, lines and plans should be in italics.

6. References

References should be numbered in the order they are mentioned in the text. The

Note: PowerPoint slides are not acceptable for the conference proceedings publication and should not be submitted.

References

All proceedings manuscripts must include a references section. Each reference must include complete information about the source material.

Transfer of Copyright

The publisher requires a transfer of copyright from the author or author's employer prior to publication in the conference proceedings.

Submitting Your Manuscript

Manuscripts should be submitted in both MS Word and PDF format.
